What's been happening at Christ Church?

A small subcommittee has been working hard over the past few months towards the dream of creating a heritage centre at Christ Church and acquiring a small section adjacent to the north side of the Church. We have moved a little closer with the purchaser of the adjacent four flat property offering to sell the section to the CCPS and creating an easement over the driveway to gain access. There is still, however, a lot of work to do, including obtaining agreement from the Wellington Anglican Diocese. Once that happens, the fundraising will begin! 2014 marks the 160th Anniversary of Christ Church Taita. Our small committee has not been in a position to organise a large celebration and the third Heritage Garden Party has now been reduced to an Open day from 12.30 pm, concluding with a special celebratory service at 2.30 pm. This will replace our normal annual service in June, when it is often very cold and wet. We will have graveyard tours and encourage people with a connection to Christ Church to come along and share their family memories. Bring a picnic lunch or purchase a tasty sandwich and cake from our selection for sale.
