Grant and Painting

We are delighted to report that the painting of the church is complete. Our painter, Chris Pynenburg and his team have done an amazing job, taking a great deal of pride in completing this job. As they worked, they found a number of areas that needed repair and have attended to these as well: They have replaced the back steps, which were rotten; the louvered section under the spire had been the home of many families of birds for many years. There is now a mesh covering the louvres to stop the birds getting in, much to their dismay. The spire and cross were found to have some rot and this has been repaired.

Chris has pointed out that we will need to undertake ongoing maintenance in order to keep Christ Church in tip top condition; for example, the inside of the windows need stripping and revarnishing, so we will again be looking to grant providers to see if we can continue to do this work.
