Change from Cottage Museum to Visitor Centre

The Christ Church Cottage Museum Trust have decided not to proceed with the planned Cottage Museum on the section next to Christ Church but to work with the Preservation Society to build a smaller Visitor Centre within the grounds of the Church yard. Plans are now underway to engage the Architect who designed the amenities block, to design our Visitor Centre alongside that building.

We are meeting at the end of November with descendants of Chief Matangi, who is buried with his whanau in the graveyard, and the Wellington Tenths Trust in order to involve the Tangata Whenua from the

start of the Visitor Centre as Maori and the Early Settlers worked together when Christ Church was built. We want to tell and display the history and heritage of us all.

Please continue to support us as we seek to enhance Christ Church as a welcoming place open some times each week for visitors. Many groups continue to visit us but only as pre-arranged with Committee Members. The Visitor Centre will have displays to be seen by any visitors and will be a place for volunteers to tell our stories and show people the Church and graveyard.
