Welcome to our new normal. Life has certainly changed in the past few months! However, 166 years on, Christ Church remains a constant in the Hutt Valley and continues to give joy to all who enter the grounds. Mary Stevens and our gardener Theresa Greally have the grounds looking amazing. We have removed a couple of dead and dying conifer trees on the northern boundary beside the Harris and Avery graves, really opening up this area. The old fence will be replaced, continuing on from the Ngaire Wild Memorial Courtyard by the Utility Block.

The Chilton rose in memory of Wendy Routley will be planted below the ashes wall and we are working on plans to erect a seat around the large tree by this wall – another gift from Wendy.

The shelter over the Singer Memorial seat will soon have a roof.

The lockdown has meant that we have had no weddings or other visits to the church since March. This will have an effect on our already small income from these sources. However we are starting to get firm bookings for weddings at the end of this year.

Our postponed Annual General Meeting will now be held on Saturday 12 September at 10.30 am. By holding this meeting on a Saturday we hope to encourage better attendance. Our small committee has been very loyal for a number of years now and it would be great to have some new members.

The 166th Annual Service has been moved to Sunday 1 November to coincide with Wellington Heritage Week. We will open the Church at 12 noon, Ian McCulloch will take a tour of the graveyard at 1.00 pm and the Service will commence at 2.00 pm, followed by afternoon tea.

We are looking forward to hearing Rev Colin Barnes' recollection of his time caring for the church during the fire of 1989.
