That trust now has the consent of the Anglican Diocesan Trustees, the Historic Places Trust and the Preservation Society to construct the building to plans consented to by Hutt City Council. We hope that they can get a builder started on this without further delay. They are also working with the local education sector and tangata whenua to develop the ways in which Christ Church can be part of the increased emphasis on teaching of local history in schools.
